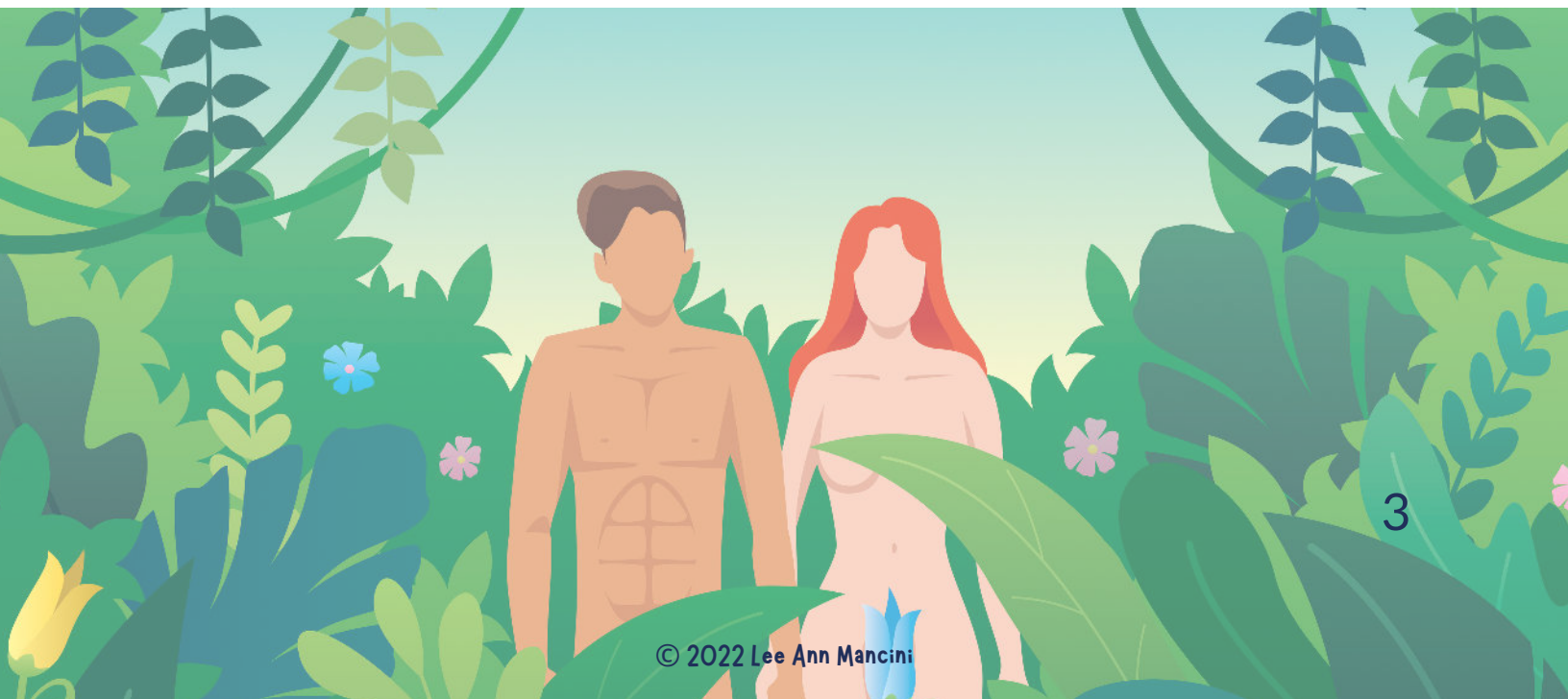

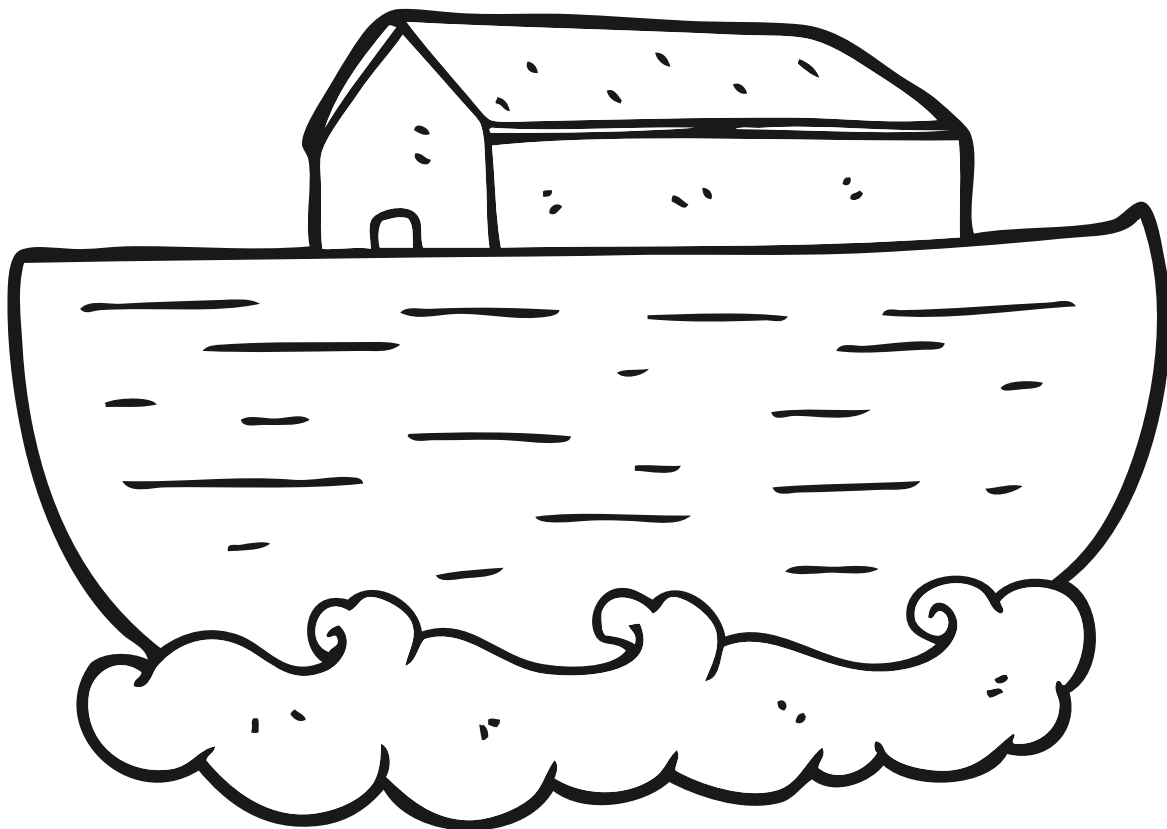


NOAH'S ARK

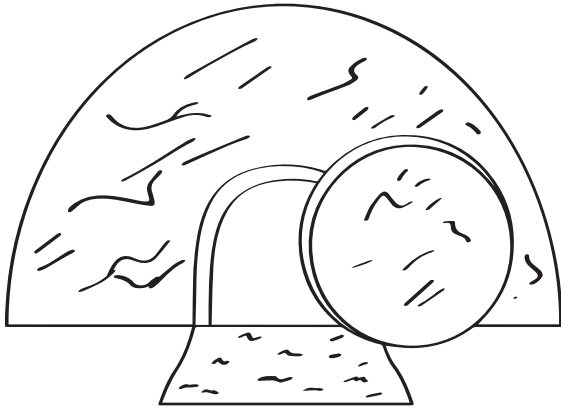
